Instructions for Writing Letters of Hope for Syria

- 1. You can write anything. A letter, a poem, a drawing, a song, a thought. As long as it is positive. You can write a brief letter letting someone know you are keeping them in your heart, hoping for an end to war, or wishing that better times will come.
- 2. Feel free to say a little bit about yourself, but keep the greeting simple. Many Syrians can read some English, but don't assume they are fluent or that translators will always be available. Feel free to include a photo of yourself or your family.
- 3. You can send anything that can fit inside an envelope. You can buy a store-bought card and write a short note to go along with it.
- 4. You can choose to include your name or to include your return address, but it may not be possible for the recipient to send a response.
- 5. Send your letters to our PO Box in Arkansas. We will be shipping or flying them to our team in Turkey who will personally bring them to Syria for delivery.
- 6. Do not send money or checks. This is about sending letters of hope. Please keep it positive.
- 7. This is an excellent opportunity for faith-based organizations, schools, or other community groups to connect with those in need of support and a reminder that they have not been forgotten!
